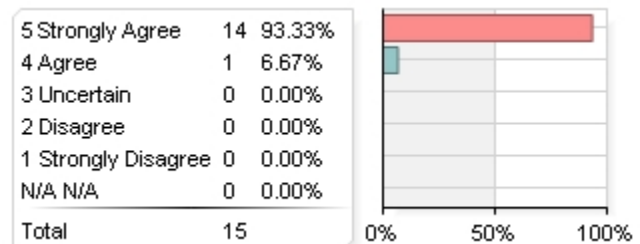

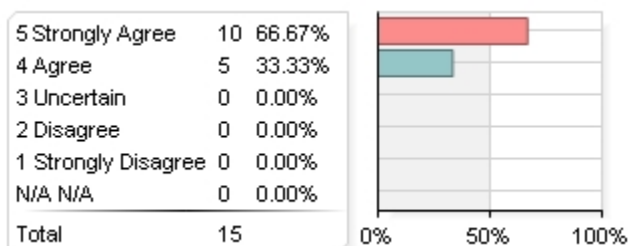

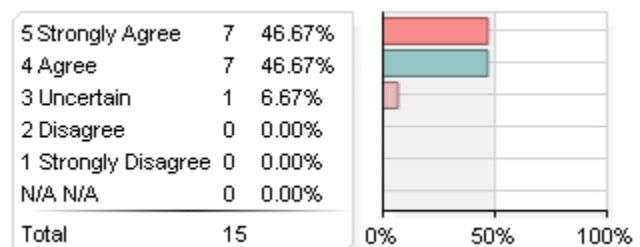

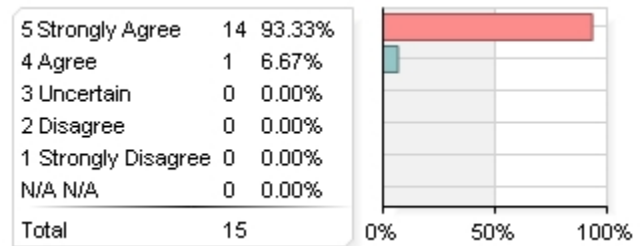

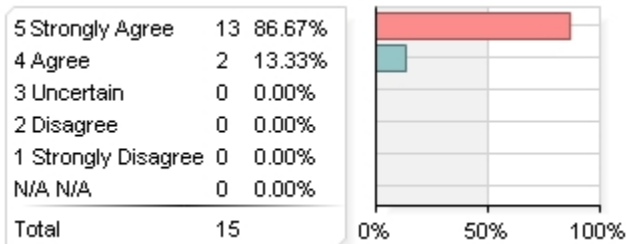

What are the strengths of this course?

Very practical knowledge mixed with reflection and strong insight into post-grad life.
I loved this class. The professor was amazing. I think it is very admirable that he was willing to share so much of his life with us and it made me very comfortable with him and the other students. There was a decent amount of reading but it was very doable. I really liked the assignments and I feel like I learned more about myself. Professor Harrington was very available for us and when I went to see him I ended up staying there for a while and we had a great conversation. I wish that I could take another class with Professor Harrington!
Really made you reflect on your life and your identity, as well as explore how this affected your career goals and family desires and personality traits. Good variety of activities and readings. Opening reflections were a nice way to calm ourselves and gain focus for the class. Perhaps he could branch out and have students come up with poems/stories for reflection occasionally.
This course was incredibly relevant to my life right now and it was organized and not an extra burden on my busy senior year. The class size was great and Professor Harrington really did a great job leading discussions.
This course truly helped me to think more about myself, my own happiness, and how I can better service the world. I loved the meditation at the beginning of class, and therefore really felt relaxed and present in each discussion. I think the topics discussed in this course are really important to consider. I think this course will change many of the decisions I make in my life (especially that between work-family) in many ways.
Professor Harrington makes this course extremely enjoyable. He lets everyone have an opinion and recognizes all of those as valid. I also thought the content of this course was extremely helpful. It really hit home the values that we are told BC should instill in us, but it is in a realistic manner. You learn how to implement these ideals into your life going forward, which I think is really necessary as a senior.
Professor is very passionate and knowledgeable about subject matter and he tells very funny stories in class. The topics were interesting and extremely relatable as we thought about ourselves and who we are. It's very helpful with "soul searching"

How could the instructor improve the course?

Comments
I have no suggestions.
Sometimes it felt a little too structured. I'm all for structure and organization, but at times it was a bit constraining. Though I learned a lot about myself, it was more via affirmation of what I already knew. I have a strong sense of where I want to go in life and what I want to do and how my values and life experiences have led me to those conclusions, so often I was underwhelmed by what the exercises "revealed" about me. Slides were excessive and often repetitive. Though his feedback was always present and shared, it could potentially be a benefit to have individual meetings with him on a very informal basis. I know many of us were interested in more specific resources or more in-depth information regarding particular areas (i.e. interviews, career resources, etc.) so that could be an option for the future if students were interested.
The course is great! It would be nice to do something similar to the end of semester dinner but early on so the students could get to know each other, even something like a class white mountain excursion would be great.

The class dinner could be at the beginning of the semester to make everyone friends with each other/ more comfortable speaking in class together for the rest of the semester.

I think requiring more short readings and less in the books would be beneficial to conversation. I also think starting the class with a poem is great but a song could also be a really great way to start each class!
Fewer readings - honestly, it was impossible to do all of them on top of homework for other classes. Try not to let your own subjectivity influence grading papers - for example, sometimes it seemed like points were lost just because you noticed something in our data that we didn't, even when we tried to be really thorough and put a lot of effort into the assignment. It's hard to know what you missed because it's such a subjective analysis.
